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

Discussion Ideas

- Did you produce more / less rubbish than you thought you would?
- Do you think you produced a lot of rubbish?
- How much of the rubbish you produced today could be recycled?
- Did you buy anything from a shop? If so think about how it was packaged. Was there any unnecessary packaging?
- How can you reduce the amount of rubbish you produce?
- Do you think it is important to think about how much and what kind of rubbish we produce?

Think about what you can do at home and in your scout group. Some ideas are listed below.

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle at home!

Ideas:

- Create your own recycling centre to recycle paper, glass, metal and plastic.
- Compost your food waste
- Take a reusable bag shopping
- Avoid over packaged goods
- Buy recycled paper products
- Avoid buying anything disposable.
- Repair items whenever possible.
- Try to reduce how much plastic you buy and use. Find alternatives.

Scout Projects:

Investigate Packaging

Save all the packaging from one weeks shopping. How much of it is really needed? How much can be recycled? What can you do about this?

Investigate Recycling

How easy is it to recycle in your home town? Investigate the recycling service, find out where all the recycle centres are. What is the policy of your local government and are they putting it into practice?
